
May 6, 1999 - Surveyor 1616 - Steven J. Favorite - indicates this position as "2-1/2" diameter capped aluminum monument, found" on County file #371213-19990506.

February 6, 2024 - I found a 2.5" diameter aluminum pipe, with a 3.25" diameter aluminum cap, stamped to identify the corner location. I also found 1 of Schulke's bearing trees and his steel sign post. The monument extends ± 18 " above grade, and is located ± 0.5 feet east of a fence running north-south, and ±2 feet north of a fence running west. I established 2 new reference monuments as shown below.

Bearings listed to the nearest second All other bearings are magnetic.





A-E 7.08(3)(e) 1989 Surveyor replaced a 1 1/4" well point with a 2 1/2" aluminum monument, 1999 Surveyor found the same, as did I in 2024.

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
